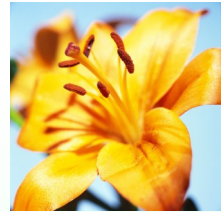

Unleashed – Sermon Notes

- 1) Dogs are great creatures. But across breeds, dogs share something. A leash affects a dog's behavior. Off leash, is it as if a switch is hit and unbounded energy is released.
- 2) There are thoughts, feelings, and attitudes that can serve as a leash in our relationship with God. Things that restrain or contain us from living more fully in our walk with Jesus.
- 3) Many of us have what are called life leashes. These life leashes are thoughts, attitudes, or actions that tell us we are too focused on ourselves or what surrounds us and not enough on God.
- 4) Here are a few: self-consciousness or worrying about what others think more than what God thinks; pre-conceptions; tradition; fear; pride; extreme self-sufficiency; money; addictions; un-forgiveness; prejudices; hard-heartedness; churches that say only clergy can or should..., etc.
- 5) What might happen if we truly let God have His way with us? What could happen if we were willing to let go as never before and freely accept the unbounded power of God that runs through us? What would happen if we took the restraints off in our walk with Jesus, just as the apostles did?
- 6) Acts written by Luke and tells the story of the spread of the story of Jesus.
- 7) Peter heals a crippled beggar. He and John are tossed into jail after which they are asked to explain themselves.
- 8) Peter explains that the man was healed by the power of Jesus.
- 9) Peter and other followers of Jesus then gather together and pray and ask God to fill them with God's power. Full of God's power they go outward and teach and heal and share.
- 10) Story in Acts is about what the power of God can do through ordinary human beings who are open to it.
- 11) The apostles understood that when you ask God to use you, fill you, and work through you, that incredible things can happen.
- 12) There really is no difference between us and the apostles because God is living in us and acting through us too.
- 13) Imagine what might happen if we let go of all restraints when it comes to our walk with Jesus.
- 14) There is no limit to what God will do through us if we believe, if we pray, if we have the guts to get off leash.
