

Our Theology Statement

In September of 2015, the Board of Trustees, National Advisory Board, and Chapel staff, gathered for an annual retreat. Having a general consensus among the leadership of the Chapel, both lay and ordained, with regard to what we believe is essential. It is vital to know what we agree upon and important for those who are part of the Snowmass Chapel family to know what we believe about our Christian faith at our core. Such a core informs all that we do.

The Leadership of Snowmass Chapel affirms The Apostles' Creed and The Nicene Creed as central tenets of our faith. We also uphold the importance of the two biblical sacraments of baptism and communion and embrace Holy Scripture as God's word and truth.

As an inclusive, diverse, Protestant, non-denominational parish, we affirm John 3:16-17 and Jesus' teaching in Matthew 22: 37-40 as fundamental to all we do, how we live, and our response to all human beings. We believe in the power of prayer, forgiveness, the transformation that comes from repentance, the work of the Holy Spirit, salvation through Jesus Christ, and the centrality of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection in our Christian walk. We celebrate and give thanks for God's grace and base our practice of faith on Jesus.
