She is an active pianist who has worked extensively with instrumentalists and vocalists alike, and has a diverse background as a solo pianist, chamber musician, choir director, and vocal coach. Her influence is her mother, a pianist and a choir conductor.



Minji received her Master's at Eastman School of Music under Dr. Jean Barr. She is currently attending Florida State University on a full scholarship in the Collaborative Piano doctorate program under Valerie Trujillo.

Minji's ambitions in music are to one day become a professor and grow the next generation of young musicians, while also touring the world using her music to fundraise for the needy in the name of Christ.
