

## Guest Musicians

CodyRay Caho hails from rural western New York where he completed an undergraduate degree in Vocal Performance from SUNY Fredonia. He will be pursuing a master's degree in Opera Performance from Arizona State University in the fall of 2016. Mr. Caho has performed with Arizona Opera, Lyric Opera Theater of ASU, Tri Cities Opera, Western New York Chamber Orchestra, Greensboro Light Opera and Song, Crittenden Opera Workshop, and Hillman Opera. His most recent roles include Belcore in Donizetti's L'elisir d'amore, Marullo in Verdi's Rigoletto, Frank in Strauss' Die Fledermaus, and Alidoro in Rossini's La Cenerentola among others. In recital repertoire he has worked and performed with Arlene Shrutt on a recital of American music. More recently he collaborated with his partner, Michael Lewis, in a performance of Schumann's Liederkreis- an experience which he holds close to his heart. He is excited to delve deeper into his studies and share his evolving passion with the Aspen Summer Music Festival and surrounding community.



Michael Lewis is currently a student in the Collaborative Piano program at Aspen Summer Music Festival. He is half way through his master's degree at Arizona State University, where he studies with Russell Ryan. Before moving to Arizona, Michael was the Assistant Music Director and Chorus Master for Tri-Cities Opera of Binghamton, NY and Adjunct Lecturer at Binghamton University. He assisted in the preparation and performance of eight fully staged productions over his two seasons there. As a vocal coach, Michael has worked with the International Vocal Arts Institute, Mill City Summer Opera, CoOPERative Program, and Ithaca College School of Music. Michael earned his undergraduate degree in Vocal Performance from Ithaca College in 2013. While at Ithaca College, Michael assisted in the creation of the first student-run opera company at the college, Ithaca College Light Opera, in which he served as assistant music director and vocal coach. He went on to lead the group in their second season as music director. The opera company continues to perform lesser known one-act operas by new and old composers. In his final year at Ithaca, Michael had the opportunity to play the title role in the opera Gianni Schicchi. This production was paired with Suor Angelica, for which Michael served as opera chorus master. Along with interpreting and performing the music of others, Michael finds equal comfort in composing for the voice and piano. His current works have been performed throughout the United States and Australia.

## Scripture Reading

### Luke 12:13-21 (NRSV)

<sup>13</sup> Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." <sup>14</sup> But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" <sup>15</sup> And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." <sup>16</sup> Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. <sup>17</sup> And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops?' <sup>18</sup> Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. <sup>19</sup> And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry.' <sup>20</sup> But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' <sup>21</sup> So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."

### Welcome Rev. Ned Mulligan!

Ned Mulligan was a successful trial lawyer who attended church only on Christmas and Easter when he was touched by the Holy Spirit at a friend's funeral. His rector convinced him that God was calling him to do something. His search for that purpose led him to divinity school, a series of school chaplaincies, and eventually to St. John's School.



Although his goal after seminary was to be a parish priest, he was called to be the head chaplain of the Salisbury School and has been a school chaplain ever since. He has also filled many other roles, including part-time interim rector for a nearby Episcopal parish for a year and a half, and rector of a summer parish in the north shore of Boston for two years. He enjoys wearing multiple hats.

Ned and his wife, Pam, currently live in Houston, Texas where Ned serves as the Director of Spiritual Life at St. John's School.
