

## Welcome Rev. Gregory Han!


Rev. Gregory Han is a half-Asian, Midwestern-raised, Jesuit-educated, Harvard-trained, Texas-residing, Presbyterian minister. Greg has had a varied career, serving as a hospital chaplain, Presbyterian minister, and secondary school teacher. He is currently the Director of Interfaith Relations at Interfaith Ministries for Greater Houston (IMGH), which is Houston's oldest interfaith service organization. He holds degrees from Georgetown University and Harvard Divinity School.

Scott MacCracken has performed extensively throughout the western slope with Aspen Community Theatre, Symphony in the Valley, the Aspen Choral Society, Aspen Music Festival, and Theatre Aspen in productions including 1776, Chicago, A Little Night Music, Side by Side by Sondheim, and Ballad of Baby Doe, and was seen recently as Juan Peron in Evita. He can be heard around town in such groups as The Local Vocals (do-wop and Christmas carols), and in the Aspen Mountain gondola with Mahatma and the Gondoliers.



Terry Lee holds Bachelor of Music and Master of Music degrees in piano performance from the University of the Pacific. Since moving to Aspen in 1980, Ms. Lee has performed in solo recitals, church services and weddings, and has accompanied dance classes, choirs, ensembles, and soloists including Lynn Harrell in a benefit concert for the Wheeler Opera House. Ms. Lee retired after 19 years as the Director of Development at Colorado Rocky Mountain School where she also co-directed the school's musicals. She has been the music director for shows at Thunder River Theatre, CMC Theatre, and for Theatre Aspen student productions. When not at the piano, Ms. Lee is an avid fiber artist and gardener.

## Scripture Reading

Romans 12:1-21 (NRSV)

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters,[a] by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual[b] worship. <sup>2</sup> Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

<sup>3</sup> For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. <sup>4</sup> For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, <sup>5</sup> so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. <sup>6</sup> We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; <sup>7</sup> ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; <sup>8</sup> the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

<sup>9</sup> Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; <sup>10</sup> love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. <sup>11</sup> Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. <sup>12</sup> Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. <sup>13</sup> Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

<sup>14</sup> Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. <sup>15</sup> Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. <sup>16</sup> Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. <sup>17</sup> Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. <sup>18</sup> If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all. <sup>19</sup> Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave room for the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord." <sup>20</sup> No, "if your enemies are hungry, feed them; if they are thirsty, give them something to drink; for by doing this you will heap burning coals on their heads." <sup>21</sup> Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.
