

Philippians 2:1-11

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, ² then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. ³ Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, ⁴ not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others. ⁵ In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: ⁶ Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; ⁷ rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death—even death on a cross! ⁹ Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Jiaying Ding

Born in Shenyang, China. She is currently a junior student in Juilliard School. After she graduated from primary school, Ms. Ding studied piano with Professor Jin Zhang. In 2008, she entered the Central Conservatory of Music. In 2012 she entered the Pre-College of Juilliard.



Ms. Ding was a prizewinner in the twelfth "Xing-Hai Cup" of All-China Youth & Children piano contest, the Fourth "Asian Youth Music Competition" in Beijing, The Seventh International Frederik Chopin Competition of Young Pianists. Ms. Ding has participated in a number of festivals including Aspen Music Festival, Banff Music Festival, Bowdoin International Music Festival, Gijon International Piano Festival in Spain, Amalfi Coast & Arts Festival in Italy, the Morningside Music Bridge, Shanghai International music Festival & Academy, and University of Florida International Piano Festival.

Eloise Hodges, a Denver native, is a freshman at Harvard University and currently studies violin with Kristopher Tong of the Borromeo Quartet and the New England Conservatory faculty. She has also studied with David Halen, concertmaster of the St. Louis Symphony, and Cornelia Heard at the Aspen Music Festival in the summers of 2017 and 2016, respectively. She has played in master classes for members of the Juilliard, Emerson, and Cleveland string quartets.



Eloise was a second-prize winner of the American Protégé International Competition of Romantic Music and performed at Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in December 2014, and returned to Carnegie Hall in the summer of 2016 with the Denver Young Artists Orchestra. In February 2015, Eloise received first place in the senior division of the Aurora Symphony Orchestra's Young Artists Solo Competition.

Eloise is a founding member of InTune String Ensemble (www.intunestrings.org), a 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to raising money for charities benefitting children in need. To date, the quartet has donated in cash and time over \$75,000. Eloise also volunteers with El Sistema Colorado.
