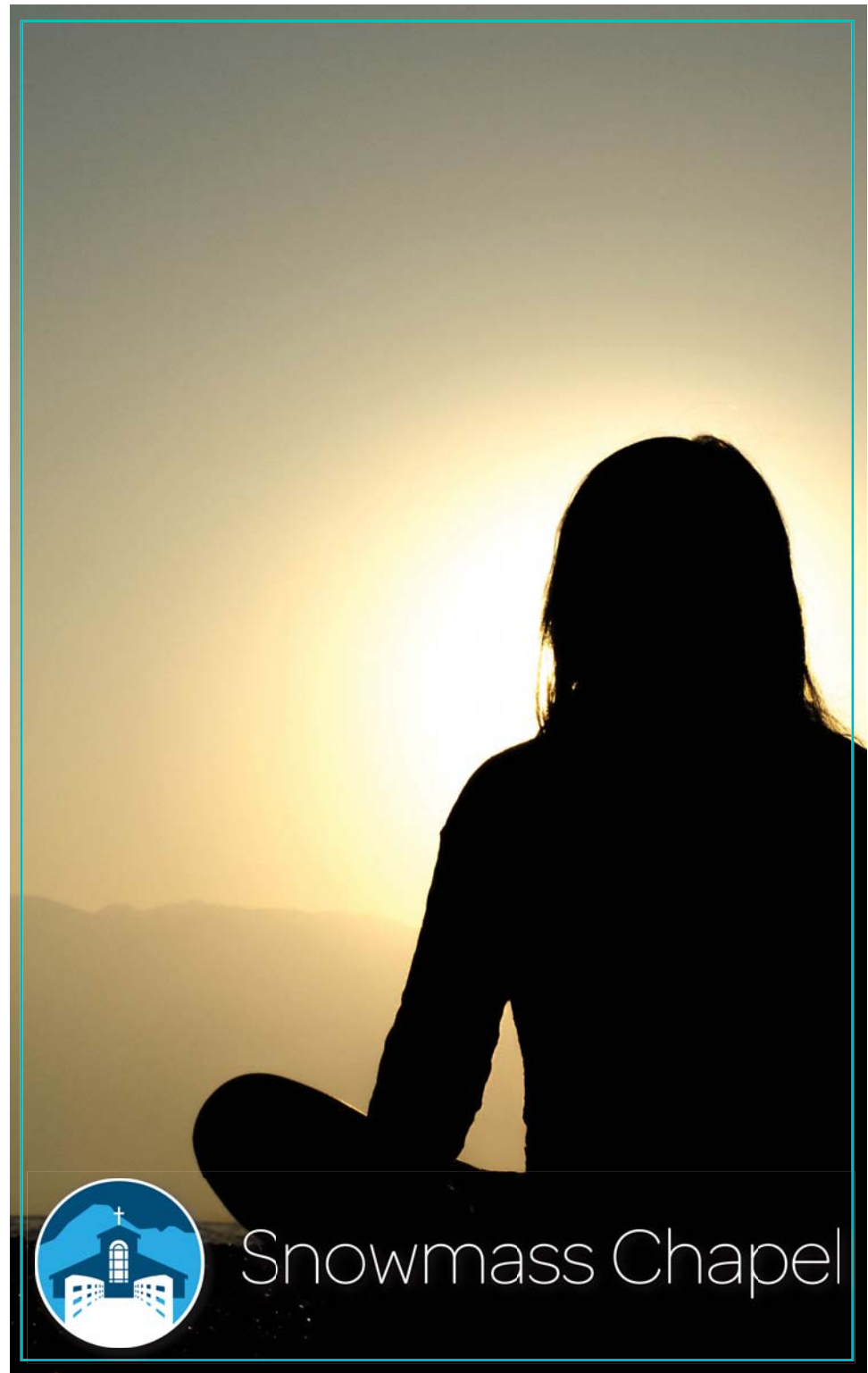

That's why we are committed to connecting people with the mental health resources they need. Sometimes you need a pastor, sometimes you need a counselor.

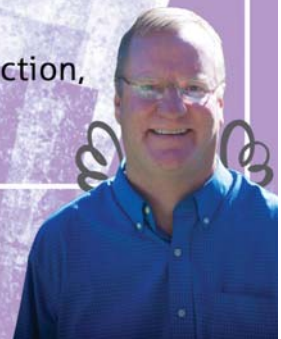
Sometimes you need both.

Today's Scripture Reading

Luke 7:36-38; 44-50 (NLV)

One of the proud religious law-keepers wanted Jesus to eat with him. Jesus went to his house and sat down to eat. ³⁷ There was a woman in the city who was a sinner. She knew Jesus was eating in the house of the proud religious law-keeper. She brought a jar of special perfume. ³⁸ Then she stood behind Him by His feet and cried. Her tears wet His feet and she dried them with her hair. She kissed His feet and put the special perfume on them.

⁴⁴ He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I came into your house and you gave Me no water to wash My feet. She washed My feet with her tears and dried them with the hairs of her head. ⁴⁵ You gave me no kiss, but this woman has kissed my feet from the time I came in. ⁴⁶ You did not put even oil on My head but this woman has put special perfume on My feet. ⁴⁷ I tell you, her many sins are forgiven because she loves much. But the one who has been forgiven little, loves little." ⁴⁸ Then He said to the woman, "Your sins are forgiven."⁴⁹ Those who were eating with Him began to say to themselves, "Who is this Man Who even forgives sins?" ⁵⁰ He said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you from the punishment of sin. Go in peace."
