

Ephesians 4:1-6 The Message (MSG)

¹⁻³ In light of all this, here's what I want you to do. While I'm locked up here, a prisoner for the Master, I want you to get out there and walk—better yet, run!—on the road God called you to travel. I don't want any of you sitting around on your hands. I don't want anyone strolling off, down some path that goes nowhere. And mark that you do this with humility and discipline—not in fits and starts, but steadily, pouring yourselves out for each other in acts of love, alert at noticing differences and quick at mending fences. ⁴⁻⁶ You were all called to travel on the same road and in the same direction, so stay together, both outwardly and inwardly. You have one Master, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who rules over all, works through all, and is present in all. Everything you are and think and do is permeated with Oneness.


John 17:20-23 (The Message)

Today's Special Music

American baritone Michael Aiello returns to the Aspen Opera Center for his third summer, this year singing the role of Sam in Bernstein's Trouble in Tahiti. Previous roles with the Aspen Opera Center include Angel 6 in Seven Angels by Luke Bedford and Jules in A Wedding by William Bolcom. Other credits include the title role in Mozart's Don Giovanni and Marcello in Puccini's La Boheme in San Diego, CA and Tom in Gershwin's Blue Monday with Opera de Tijuana. Throughout his time in graduate school at the University of Colorado at Boulder, Michael enjoyed success in Stravinsky's The Rake's Progress as Nick Shadow, Mark Adamo's Little Women as Friedrich Bhaer, and Figaro in Le nozze di Figaro. Most recently on the concert stage he was the baritone soloist for the Monteverdi Vespro della Beata Vergine at the Cathedral of the Madeleine in Salt Lake City under the direction of Dr. Craig Jessop. In 2016 Michael received the second place award in the Palm Springs Opera Guild Rossini Competition adjudicated by the famous Rossini tenor, Rockwell Blake. Mr. Aiello holds a master's degree in voice performance from the University of Colorado at Boulder and a bachelor's degree from the State University of New York at Fredonia in music education. This fall, Michael will be starting his doctoral degree in Vocal Performance and Literature at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York.
