

Today’s Scripture Reading

1 Kings 19 (NLT)

Elijah Flees to Sinai

¹⁹ When Ahab got home, he told Jezebel everything Elijah had done, including the way he had killed all the prophets of Baal. ² So Jezebel sent this message to Elijah: “May the gods strike me and even kill me if by this time tomorrow I have not killed you just as you killed them.”

³ Elijah was afraid and fled for his life. He went to Beersheba, a town in Judah, and he left his servant there. ⁴ Then he went on alone into the wilderness, traveling all day. He sat down under a solitary broom tree and prayed that he might die. “I have had enough, Lord,” he said. “Take my life, for I am no better than my ancestors who have already died.”

Mark 15:33-41 (NLT)

³³ At noon, darkness fell across the whole land until three o’clock. ³⁴ Then at three o’clock Jesus called out with a loud voice, “Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?” which means “My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?”

³⁵ Some of the bystanders misunderstood and thought he was calling for the prophet Elijah. ³⁶ One of them ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, holding it up to him on a reed stick so he could drink. “Wait!” he said. “Let’s see whether Elijah comes to take him down!”

³⁷ Then Jesus uttered another loud cry and breathed his last. ³⁸ And the curtain in the sanctuary of the Temple was torn in two, from top to bottom.

³⁹ When the Roman officer who stood facing him[h] saw how he had died, he exclaimed, “This man truly was the Son of God!”

⁴⁰ Some women were there, watching from a distance, including Mary Magdalene, Mary (the mother of James the younger and of Joseph[i]), and Salome. ⁴¹ They had been followers of Jesus and had cared for him while he was in Galilee. Many other women who had come with him to Jerusalem were also there.

Today's Special Music

Amanda Crider, mezzo-soprano, has quickly won national attention for her “gleaming vocalism” (Boston Globe). The Wall Street Journal declared, “the eloquent Ms. Crider carried the evening,” while the New York Times praised her “winsome, vulnerable and deeply expressive” performance in the role of Alma in the world premiere of Persona with Beth Morrison Projects. Her current season included a debut with Los Angeles Opera, the title role of Cenerentola for Orlando Opera and a return to Apollo’s Fire in Monteverdi’s L’Orfeo. Upcoming in the 2018-19 season, Ms. Crider will return to Apollo’s Fire for Bach’s Mass in b minor, sing the title role in L’incoronazione di Poppea with Florentine Opera, appear as Mezzo Soloist with Amarillo Symphony in Bernstein’s Jeremiah Symphony and Beethoven’s 9th Symphony, and sing in multiple concerts with Seraphic Fire. Other opera engagements include roles with Dallas Opera, Boston Lyric Opera, Florida Grand Opera, The Castleton Festival, and Glimmerglass Opera among others. Amanda is a core member of the Grammy nominated ensemble, Seraphic Fire. Ms. Crider is also the Founder and Artistic Director of IlluminArts, Miami’s Art Song and Vocal Chamber Music Series.



Conductor and pianist **Scott Allen Jarrett** is the Director of Music at Boston University’s Marsh Chapel, Music Director of the Back Bay Chorale, and the Artistic Director of the Bach Akademie of Charlotte (NC). Also in Boston, Jarrett is the Resident Conductor of the Handel + Haydn Society.



Jarrett is recognized as one of our nation’s leading teachers and interpreters of the vocal works of Johann Sebastian Bach. A long-time collaborator with the Oregon Bach Festival, Jarrett is Director of the Vocal Fellows Program and in 2017 conducted the festival’s opening performances of the St Matthew Passion—the only conductor other than Helmuth Rilling to have conducted that masterpiece at the Oregon Bach Festival since its founding. He returns to OBF in 2018 as the conductor of the Discovery Series, teaching two of Bach’s early Leipzig cantatas.

A regular collaborator with Seraphic Fire, Jarrett can be heard on Seraphic Fire’s albums Brahms: Ein Deutsches Requiem and Monteverdi’s Vespers of the Blessed Virgin, 1610.
