## **Today's Scripture Readings**

### **Luke 9:43-62 The Message (MSG)**

<sup>43-44</sup> While they continued to stand around exclaiming over all the things he was doing, Jesus said to his disciples, "Treasure and ponder each of these next words: The Son of Man is about to be betrayed into human hands."

<sup>45</sup> They didn't get what he was saying. It was like he was speaking a foreign language and they couldn't make heads or tails of it. But they were embarrassed to ask him what he meant.

<sup>46-48</sup> They started arguing over which of them would be most famous. When Jesus realized how much this mattered to them, he brought a child to his side. "Whoever accepts this child as if the child were me, accepts me," he said. "And whoever accepts me, accepts the One who sent me. You become great by accepting, not asserting. Your spirit, not your size, makes the difference."

<sup>49</sup> John spoke up, "Master, we saw a man using your name to expel demons and we stopped him because he wasn't of our group."

<sup>50</sup> Jesus said, "Don't stop him. If he's not an enemy, he's an ally."

<sup>51-54</sup> When it came close to the time for his Ascension, he gathered up his courage and steeled himself for the journey to Jerusalem. He sent messengers on ahead. They came to a Samaritan village to make arrangements for his hospitality. But when the Samaritans learned that his destination was Jerusalem, they refused hospitality. When the disciples James and John learned of it, they said, "Master, do you want us to call a bolt of lightning down out of the sky and incinerate them?"

<sup>55-56</sup> Jesus turned on them: "Of course not!" And they traveled on to another village.

<sup>57</sup> On the road someone asked if he could go along. "I'll go with you, wherever," he said.

<sup>58</sup> Jesus was curt: "Are you ready to rough it? We're not staying in the best inns, you know."

Jesus said to another, "Follow me."

<sup>59</sup> He said, "Certainly, but first excuse me for a couple of days, please. I have to make arrangements for my father's funeral."

<sup>60</sup> Jesus refused. "First things first. Your business is life, not death. And life is urgent: Announce God's kingdom!"

<sup>61</sup> Then another said, "I'm ready to follow you, Master, but first excuse me while I get things straightened out at home."

<sup>62</sup> Jesus said, "No procrastination. No backward looks. You can't put God's kingdom off till tomorrow. Seize the day."

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## Today's Special Music

Japanese pianist **Madoka Asari** is a highly sought after collaborator who has performed in the U.S.A., Japan, France, and the Czech Republic. Madoka has played with some of today's most prominent artists including Geraldine Walther (Takács Quartet), Clive Greensmith (Montrose Trio/Tokyo Quartet), Michelle Kim (New York Philharmonic), and Caleb Hudson (Canadian Brass). Her active performing career has taken her to venues such as Carnegie's Weill Recital Hall, Hahn Hall (Santa Barbara, CA), Boettcher Concert Hall (Denver, CO) and Sapporo Concert Hall Kitara. Madoka's performances have been featured on Colorado Public Radio, and in an album with a cellist Roberto Arundale, *Confluencia: Music of Latin America*.



Madoka has served on faculty of the Collaborative Piano department at Colorado State University, as an interim staff pianist at University of Colorado at Boulder, and as an Associate Instructor of Music Theory at Indiana University Bloomington. In 2018, Madoka began working as a pianist for Colorado Children's Chorale. She holds a Master of Music degree from Indiana University and Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Denver. Her teachers and coaches have included Steven Mayer, Evelyne Brancart, Shigeo Neriki, Rita Sloan and Jonathan Feldman.

**John Fawcett** is a violinist pursuing his Bachelor of Music degree at the Colburn Conservatory of Music, where he studies with Robert Lipsett. Since his solo orchestral debut at age nine, he has been a winner of multiple music competitions, and has performed as a soloist with the Central Oregon Symphony, Oregon Mozart Players, the Portland MetroArts Orchestra, the Sunriver Music Festival Orchestra, and Pink Martini. He is a three-time Cascades Classical Music Foundation gold medalist, an OSA solo violin champion, a National YoungArts winner, MTNA National Senior Strings Finalist, and a six-time recipient of a Sunriver Music Festival Young Artist Scholarship. Mr. Fawcett performed in Carnegie Hall as a member of the New York String Orchestra, and was featured on NPR's *From the Top*. He has attended the Meadowmount School of Music and the Heifetz International Music Institute. Previously, Mr. Fawcett studied with Jan Mark Sloman and Kathryn Lucktenberg.
