MinTze Wu is the Founder and Artistic Director of Sounds of Lyons in Colorado and BenFeng Music Festival & Studio in Taiwan. A violinist of many passions, she has been heard on stages from the pubs in Poland, opera houses in Italy, concert halls in Australia, US, Taiwan, and the remote villages in Newfoundland. A graduate from Cleveland Institute of Music, she has pursued a fulfilling career exploring classical music as an expressive medium of performance art, and has collaborated with notable filmmakers, story tellers, theatre directors, writers, calligraphers, and visual artists in multi-disciplinary productions in both Asia and North America.



Chih-Long Hu performs extensively in Asia, Europe, and America appearing as a concerto soloist, recitalist, and chamber musician. He has been heard on "Performance Today" through NPR and his CD albums "Formosa Caprices", "Complete Rachmaninov Etudes-Tableaux", and "Trifecta Trio" have received critical acclaim. Named "Teacher of the Year" by the Tennessee Music Teachers Association, Hu is also the Artistic Director of St. Andrews Piano Academy and Festival International in New Brunswick, as well as the New York International Piano Festival. Dr. Hu is the Sandra G. Powell Endowed Professor of Piano at The University of Tennessee.

Youth Mental Health First Aid is designed to teach parents, family members, caregivers, teachers, school staff, peers, neighbors, health and human services workers, and other caring citizens how to help an adolescent (age 12-18) who is experiencing a mental health or addiction challenge or is in crisis. Research has shown that the training reduces stigma, enhances behavioral health literacy, and improves participants' behavioral health.

Access to services in remote rural and frontier counties can be logistically challenging. This MHFA class matches the strengths of rural communities with their unique barriers to accessing care.
